

# The architecture of the wine: The Origin

The history of the Ribera del Duero's wine goes back more than 2.000 years when in the Celtiberian and Roman times it already represented one of the main agricultural activities in the area. But it's in the Middle Ages when its production and marketing became the driving force in the area, thanks to some hidden gems: the underground cellars.



The wine, like architecture, is also a way of art. For this reason, in recent years several of the wineries have been built following avant-garde design trends, modernizing their facilities and turning them into true monuments dedicated to wine. Architects such as Richard Rogers or Norman Foster, who designed Bodegas Protos and Bodegas Portia buildings, respectively, are some of the most outstanding examples.

The headquarters of the Designation of Origin Regulatory Council of Ribera del Duero has opted for the coexistence of styles, maintaining its original headquarter located in an old 16th century hospital next to a new building, a large avant-garde tower that emulates a bunch of grapes with its oval windows.

# The cultural heritage of Ribera del Duero


Archeological sites, Roman temples, castles, bridges, monasteries and palaces are just a sample of the monumental diversity of Ribera del Duero's towns.

- **Eight towns are Historical Artistic Sites:** Gumiel de Izán, Haza, Langa de Duero, Peñafiel, Peñaranda de Duero, Rejas de San Esteban, San Esteban de Gormaz and Vadocondes.
- More than 30 places of Cultural Interest.
- Caleruega (Burgos) belongs to **The Most Beautiful Towns of Spain**.
- Peñaranda de Duero (Burgos), Peñafiel (Valladolid) and San Esteban de Gormaz (Soria) are **Magical Spanish Towns**.



# Pleasure at the table

Suckling roast lamb is a must try from the local cuisine: roasted in an oven with holm oak, it has a quality Brand (I.G.P.) that guarantees its quality from its origin until the way to be cooked and served. But this delicious and healthy dish comes very well accompanied by other local products such as Ribera black pudding, vegetables, cheeses, lamb chops cooked by Ribera's barbecue style, Torrezno of Soria, mushrooms, truffles or the typical olive oil, which complete the extensive traditional local recipes.



# Enjoy your freedom in nature

You'll find a high value Natural Sites such as Hoces del Río Riaza Natural Park in Montejo de la Vega (Segovia), the most important European bird prey refuge or the Natural Path of Duero river, a 134-kilometer path that can be traveled on foot, by bicycle or even on horseback.



# A vibrant region

Cultural summers follow one another with patron saint festivities, some declared a Festival of Tourist Interest, such as **La Bajada del Ángel** of Holy Week (Aranda de Duero and Peñafiel) or **'El Chúndara'** (Peñafiel).



**Sonorama-Ribera Music Festival**, which every August brings together more than 100,000 people, or the **Great Grape Harvest Festival**, which is held the last weekend of September, are some of the most outstanding events.
